

Colorado Wolf and Wildlife Center (CWWC)

Committed Vs. Non-Committed Volunteer

Committed Volunteers:

- Must commit to at least 2 days per week and no less than 90 days.
- ➤ \$300 non-refundable training fee and \$150 refundable radio deposit required.
- Duties may include but are not limited to giving educational tours, guiding alpha and fox experiences, grounds work, general chores, and conducting research.
- ➤ Once approved by a senior staff member to "graduate" as a tour guide, you will then be eligible to interact with approved animals only.
- You will have privileges such as interacting with wolves, involvement in meetings, learning a variety of animal husbandry skills, and veterinary classes offered at no cost to you.
- ➤ CWWC is an AZA (Association of Zoos and Aquariums) certified facility. As such, Committed Volunteers can earn college credit in a related field of study.

Non-Committed Volunteers:

- You are not expected to be on a regular schedule or be on-site at CWWC for the full day.
- > \$150 refundable radio deposit required.
- ➤ Jobs will vary depending on the season but may include grounds work and general chores.
- ➤ You will not be able to enter wolf enclosures (unless you have paid for the Alpha experience).
- You will work around the animals.
- ➤ With permission, you *may* be able to work with the minis (miniature horse and miniature donkeys).
- You *may* be able to work with foxes. Working with the foxes will be dependent on a number of variables, including senior staff member approval and number of days worked.
